# Why do we have a privacy notice?

Clare Council has created this privacy notice in order to demonstrate our firm commitment to privacy and to assure you that in all your dealings with Clare County Council that we will ensure the security of the data you provide to us. Clare County Council's commitment is that any personal data you have supplied to us and may be required to supply in the future is;

- Obtained lawfully, fairly and in a transparent manner
- Obtained for only specified, explicit and legitimate purposes
- Adequate, relevant and limited to what is necessary for purpose for which it was obtained
- Recorded, stored accurately and securely and where necessary kept up to date
- Kept only for as long as is necessary for the purposes for which it was obtained
- Kept in a form which permits identification of the data subject
- Processed only in a manner that ensures the appropriate security of the personal data including protection against unauthorised or unlawful processing.

# Is the personal data submitted as part of this activity shared with other organisations?

Clare Council, to fulfil statutory our regulatory obligations or in the public interest, from time to time, have to share personal data with other organisations or entities. Where this is required Clare County Council shall have regard to the security and integrity of the data and will minimise the data shared. In this process, the data will be shared with the following recipients:

Mid West National Road Design Office, Lisanalta House, Dooradoyle, Limerick

In this regard, Clare County Council has entered into a Data Processing Agreement with Limerick City and County Council in order to regulate the transfer of personal data by the Council to the Mid West National Road Design Office and to ensure that this is carried out in accordance with the applicable Data Protection Legislation.

#### How long is this personal data held by Clare Council?

Clare County Council has a detailed record retention policy which goes in to more detail of the time period for which your personal data will be retained and what will happen to it after the required retention period has expired.

The data processed as part of this activity will be retained for the following period(s): Landowner files are retained permanently. Personal information held on file will be deleted when it is no longer required.

#### **Submissions and Objections**

Please note that objections to the N67/N85 Inner Relief Road Ennistymon (Blake's Corner) Compulsory Purchase Order 2020 will be put on public display.

#### **Your Rights**

You have the right to request access to personal data held about you, obtain confirmation as to whether data concerning you exists, be informed of the content and source of data and check its accuracy. In addition, if the data held by us is found to be inaccurate you have the right to change, remove, block, or object to the use of, personal data held by Clare County Council. You also have the right to data portability.

In certain circumstances blocking access to data may delay or remove access to a service where the data is required by law or for essential purposes related to delivery of a service to you.
