DRUGS

Gardaí in Ennis were on patrol when they observed a vehicle acting suspiciously. A subsequent stop resulted in the driver being arrested.

A follow up investigation took place which included searches under warrant. Approx. €15,500 of suspected Cocaine and cannabis was seized, pending forensic analysis. Furthermore a quantity of cash and designer goods were seized.

On the 6th September 2023 an operation in Ennis was led by the Crime Office at Ennis Garda accompanied by the Clare Divisional Drugs Unit and personnel from the Kilrush, Shannon and Killaloe Crime Offices, the Western Region Armed Support Unit, the Southern Regional Dog Unit along with members from the regular units at Ennis, Kilrush, Ennistymon, members of the Clare Divisional Protective Services Unit, Clare Divisional Scenes of Crime Unit and members of the Clare Divisional Roads Policing Unit. During the course of the search, €15,000 of suspected amphetamine 2,500 Xanax tablets, Cocaine with a total street value of €87,000, heroin valued at €500 and quantity of cash and designer goods were seized. A Smith & Wesson 66-3 revolver and 36 rounds of ammunition were located in a field also adjacent to the location being searched.

- On 15/12/2023 a search was carried out at an address in Clare and was positive for cannabis, coeaine and ammunition. Case is currently before the courts.
- On 10/03/2024 search warrant executed at an address in Clare – positive result for cocaine and cannabis. Approx.
 €45000 of drugs seized

FIREARMS RECOVERED

- On 23/10/2023 Ennis Crime Office assisted by the Clare Divisional Search recovered a firearm during the course of a search in Ennis which was stolen during the course of a burglary at Co. Galway on the 16/11/2021.
- On the 15/09/2023 personnel from the Clare Divisional Drug Unit assisted by the Emergency Response Unit discovered a suspect in possession of a high powered firearm namely a Colt M16 A1 with a magazine and a significant amount of ammunition in suspicious circumstances in a wooded area at Clonmoney West, Shannon, Co. Clare. The suspect was arrested and detained under Section 30 of the Offences Against the State Act 1939 and was later charged with offences relating to possession of firearms. He is currently before the Courts awaiting sentencing

ROBBERIES DETECTED

2 males arrested, charged and currently in relation to 4 robberiesbefore the courts in relation to the following Robberies in place for October 2023:

On 09/02/24, before Ennis District Court, a male was charged with 10 crimes including two counts of robbery dated 05/02/23 and 08/02/24. This was the result of great work by a number of members from Ennis Garda Station following the report of a robbery at a Pharmacy, Ennis.

ORGANISED CRIME



Before the courts is a male who has pleaded guilty to:

- Participating/contributing an OCG to commit a serious offence
- Section 7 Money Laundering €30,000 cash
- Section 183 of the Criminal Justice Act 2006 Purpose connected with the commission of a drug trafficking offence namely 2x Ballistic vests, Benzocaine Mixing Agent, Cocaine Press and latex gloves
- Section 27A Firearms in relation to Ruger Rifle (Semi-Automatic modified barrel), Rifle Magazine and 19 Rounds of .22ammunition
- Section 15A Misuse of Drugs Cocaine and Cannabis to the value of €71,568.

Two other associates of this case have also pleaded guilty to Money Laundering offences. The facts of the case were given on the 7th March 2024 at Ennis Circuit Court and it was remanded until the 1st of May 2024 by Judge Comerford for sentencing.

Operation Feilire has been established to target feud related activity in Ennis and North Clare. An Incident Room has been established at Ennis Garda Station to coordinate this operation. The operation commenced on the 21/11/2023 and will run for an, as of yet, undetermined period. There have been 644 incidents and 773 pieces of intel carried out since the commencement of this operation.
