At the outset, the members expressed condolences to Helen Walsh on her recent family bereavement.

# 1) Minutes of Meeting held on 20th February 2024

The Minutes of the meeting held on 20<sup>th</sup> February 2024 were proposed by Cllr. Murphy, seconded by Cllr. McInerney and agreed.

## 2) Matters arising

Cllr. McInerney re. dangerous footpaths in towns and villages - more LIS funding required.

Cllr. Hayes queried contradictory nature over who is making decisions on Active Travel funding; Department say it is at the discretion of the local authority.

Anne Haugh advised CCC has been consistent in submitting applications for rural areas around the county – have not been successful; Council can submit and prioritise but Department decide. Cllr. Killeen & Cllr. Murphy requested clarity be established as to who is responsible for allocation of Active Travel funding.

Bernadette Haugh advised the focus of CLAR 2024 is the development of community facilities; limited to 15 applications.

#### 3) Tourism Directorate Update

Cllr. Hayes thanked all for their presentations.

Cllr. Murphy advised motorhome/campervan community spaces need to be looked at from parking bye-laws perspective and ICT system should be able to take bookings; could local bursaries be used for students going in to hospitality or event management; delighted at coach capacity at Cliffs; Walk management model should provide a model for other Walks; was ducting done from Loop Head lighthouse back to entrance.

Cllr McInerney re. motorhome parking – public element, private element and community element involved; generate tagline for the county; coach industry not very well supported during Covid; sunsets at Cliffs amazing – promotion important; is the SLA with the Council standardised; is there funding in the Budget for all ICT work; is the office in Clare Business Park Council owned; compliment the hubs – vital for tourism sector.

Denis Tuohy – thanks to Leonard Cleary and wish him well in new role; can accommodation audit on campervans be shared; Government's green public procurement regarding food requires 10% organic target – does Clare have such a target; Outdoor Recreation Strategy for Slieve Bloom – could strategy be prepared for Slieve Aughley.

Cllr. Talty – integration across all sites will be critical; figures on coaches and visitors to Cliffs and indications for 2024/2025 numbers being down will be a challenge; festivals outside of peak season are massive; negativity around condition of COM coastal walk unhelpful – important to get management plan in place.

Cllr. Killeen – presentation very impressive; a lot of changes in past 5 years; Bunratty has all the ingredients to be a world class tourist destination; marketing is really good and publicising what is available in Clare; interactive elements very important; will there be packages for school tours; key areas traffic and transport - funding not available to improve roads; shuttle bus to Burren National Park – the system is uncontrolled – needs to be co-ordinated.

Cllr. Hayes – Ennis needs to be the driver to move tourists around the county; opening of the bridge crossing in Killaloe hugely important; need to make sure the vision for next 5 years is to increase accommodation base and bed nights; having IT across the county is hugely beneficial; queried Shannon Group personnel changes.

Deirdre O'Shea – echo sentiments re. Leonard Cleary who provided great leadership for the Tourism Directorate.

- Will share motorhome/campervan review report with the SPC Committee.
- Local bursaries and event management a great idea and goes on at Cliffs.
- When the management walk model is available it will be used across the county.
- Loop Head ducting would be a planning challenge but will get there.
- Tagline mission statement of the Clare Tourism Strategy 2030 encapsulates the 4 pillars of the Clare tourism strategy; over 100,000 new customers to Visit Clare website.
- Cliffs do sunsets; will look at doing in Loop Head also.
- Bus routes TFI local link are on Tourism Advisory Forum and have provided positive inputs and are open to new opportunities.
- Ennis called out as being the centre of the county at all times.

Donnacha Lynch advised SLA in place and reviewed annually; Gort Road office is leased – no capacity in Aras Contae an Chlair; comply with Green Procurement legislation – tender processes for retail and catering underway with benchmarks for new operators to meet for products produced in Co. Clare – 14% benchmark for retail product; Shannon Heritage staff terms and conditions fully protected and will transfer from current employer to new employer.

Urban McMahon – Government funding was provided for merger project.

## 4) Rural Development Directorate Update

Bernadette Haugh briefed the members as follows:

During the lifetime of the current Council, the Rural Development SPC has met on 22 occasions to address many rural policy related issues. This period was marked by many significant challenges locally, nationally and internationally which required local government to adapt and react to an ever-changing environment including the Covid-19 pandemic and Ukrainian Crisis.
